On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff and volunteers, we would like to thank you for your support of West Suburban Humane Society in 2018. This year we celebrated 46 years of helping animals in need.

A few of the program highlights from this past year include:

- In 2018 we adopted out 543 dogs and cats. Several of these animals needed life saving medical treatment which we were able to provide through the generosity of our supporters.
- We had over 500 dedicated volunteers providing 40,000 hours of service to the shelter, through cleaning animal areas, facilitating adoptions, transporting, socializing, fostering and working special events. We couldn't survive without our wonderful volunteers.
- In 2018 we did a feasibility study to determine if we would be able to move forward with building a new adoption center. The results were favorable and at the end of 2018 we launched a \$2,000,000 capital campaign.

West Suburban Humane Society (WSHS) is a volunteer-based, animal welfare organization that was founded in 1972 as a lost and found referral service.

We provide housing for up to 25 dogs and 60 cats at a time. We operate at full capacity at all times with animal care and adoptions being provided by 2 full-time and 8 part-time employees and nearly 500 volunteers. Our facility is open to the public 6 days a week.

Mission

WSHS is dedicated to operating a premier animal shelter for the purpose of finding safe, permanent and compatible homes to adopt domestic dogs and cats. We are committed to educating and encouraging the public to humanely care for dogs and cats.

Vision

WSHS will achieve and sustain its reputation for being the premier humane organization in Illinois. To achieve such recognition, WSHS will focus on the following critical components:

Advocacy: WSHS will promote the humane care of dogs and cats by working with government agencies and other agencies to promote the humane care of animals.

Care: WSHS will be the preeminent provider of animal care, working with high quality veterinarians to provide the most appropriate medical treatment for non-terminal conditions of cats and dogs in our care. Further, WSHS will develop innovative practices, such as working with reputable trainers in the area, to ensure that every animal in our care receives the best total care before being adopted by the most compatible owner.

Education: WSHS will educate our staff, volunteers and members of the community on proper pet health care and safety. We will provide ample information and constant support to our adoptive families and act as an invaluable resource for educating the public at large.

Fundraising: WSHS will remain financially solvent and transparent so that we can continue to focus on finding new sources of revenue and maintaining our relationship with those who have provided financial contributions.

Values: We believe in the following core values:

- Serving as a resource to educate the community and animal owners about responsible dog and cat care.
- Providing high quality medical treatment for animals in our care.
- Controlling the pet population through spay and neuter.

It was the luckiest day of Toby's life when a WSHS supporter called the shelter about an injured cat she found. He was an unneutered male stray, trying to make it through outdoor life without being attacked by other males. Some of his tail was missing and what he did have was raw and painful. We immediately took him to our vet where he got the royal treatment. His wounds were cleaned up and he was neutered, vaccinated and had blood and stool tests. Everything turned out okay EXCEPT that Toby had been bitten badly by a cat that was infected with FIV. Bite wounds are the most common way FIV spreads so free-roaming, aggressive male cats are the most frequently infected and, unfortunately, Toby got in the path of one of those. Toby loves to play. He will play with a laser pointer or chase a feather wand. He likes catnip too. He gets a little wary if you are petting him and you go too far down his back near his tail, but if you suffered trauma there, you would be apprehensive too. He just needs to build trust with people.



The volunteers and staff spend time with Toby, but he is never considered for adoption because people don't understand the facts of this disease. Below is information from Dr. Patty Khuly VMD about FIV:

1. FIV is not transmissible to humans! No way. No how. Never. I don't care what you've heard tell. You should banish the thought once and for all.
2. FIV is about as transmissible as HIV. Which is to say not very. Animals in the same household cannot transmit the disease from one to another except by mating (a behavior sterilized animals will not effectively engage in) or by inflicting bite wounds (not typical even among cohabitants with bad attitudes).
3. With proper care, cats with FIV can live very long, perfectly comfortable lives.

What a shame that no one ever looks at Toby for adoption because of the stigma that cats carry like a scarlet letter: FIV+. He will make a wonderful pet for someone wanting a friendly, fun companion. Changing Toby's life will certainly change yours and you will never regret the decision!

Success Stories: Pittie Patter



Upon meeting 3-year-old Pittie Patter, it was clear she had a special spark. Pittie had come to us from Newton County Animal Control in Indiana, where they had picked her up as a stray. Despite being anxious and fearful, she had a gentle, kind nature. We knew this pit bull/terrier mix could one day make the perfect family member.

We enrolled her in our STAR training program so she could learn basic doggy manners and also how to deal with her anxieties, which included a fear of any moving object, like cars, bicycles, skateboards, and strollers. In addition to the training, several volunteers and even our Executive Director took it upon themselves to work one-on-one with Pittie to show her that these things would not hurt her. Eventually, she learned that they weren't so scary after all. She began relaxing, gaining confidence, and showing more aspects of her fun personality.

Here is what Carolyn, the Executive Director, has to say about Pittie Patter: "I have been working with Pittie Patter for over a year now. When she first arrived she had a lot of anxiety and fear. Over time and with a lot of training and patience, I saw her slowly begin to relax and gain confidence. That's when her real personality started to show through. Pittie Patter is sweet, fun, loving and loyal. I can't say enough good things about her. If I had room in my house for another dog, I would take Pittie home in a heartbeat. I love this girl and my hope is that one day soon, someone else will see what I see and make her a permanent part of their family."



Mark, a WSHS volunteer, has this to say about Pittie Patter: "Through the 8 years I have been a STAR volunteer I have walked many of these STAR-trained dogs through the neighborhoods. Pittie Patter stands out as a dog that is FUN to walk. She is truly excellent on heel. She loves to sniff stuff and keeps close attention to other dogs, squirrels, and people but is easy to bring back to attention. Mostly, I enjoy that Pittie always loves to lick my face, to roll in the grass, and to greet me happily whenever I come into her run to take her out. She will be a prize for someone who wants a friend who always has a smile and a kiss at the ready."

Pittie is the perfect combination of lap dog and active playmate. She loves a good walk, playing in a fenced-in yard, and showing off the skills she learned in STAR training. Once she gets her exercise, she's perfectly happy to cuddle up next to you, either chewing a bone or holding her favorite squeaky pig toy. Her ideal home would be adult-only and kid-free; we think she deserves to be the center of attention. She would reward you with a lifetime of loyalty.

Pittie Patter was recently adopted into her forever home and is thriving with the love and care of her new family. We are so grateful for the people who chose to adopt a pet from West Suburban Humane Society. We are especially thankful for those who adopt an animal that has been here awhile or has special adoption requirements.



WSHS is dedicated to operating a premier animal shelter that provides the best treatment for dogs and cats in its care. However, like most everything, quality services come at a price. Due to the shelter's tight budget, many animals would not be able to receive adequate care without significant withdrawal from the organization's operating budget and/or large increases in adoption fees. At the West Suburban Humane Society, we never turn our backs on an animal in need.

Since our founding in 1972, the shelter has relied completely on the generosity of its donors to provide animal care and shelter for thousands of cats and dogs. The contributions of caring and generous individuals, volunteers, adopters, and community members have empowered us to take in a cat with a broken leg and a dog with a heart condition to make sure those animals live their lives as a family's loving companion.

Where another shelter would euthanize a cat with heartworm, we make sure she gets the medication and treatment she needs. Where another shelter would turn away a litter of puppies with Parvo, we take them in and treat them until they are well. Where another shelter would euthanize a dog or cat that stayed for months, just to make room for another animal, we remain committed to getting that animal a home.

Our needs are as varied as our success stories and as big as the job we do. We're seeking funds to save lives, first and foremost. Veterinary care costs our shelter more than \$60,000 each year, and that's with the generous discounts our partner vets are able to provide. Pet food and animal care all add up to more than \$200,000 annually.

In addition, WSHS is beginning construction on a new adoption center. Our building is old and was not designed as a shelter, and though we do the best we can with what we have, our mission is to operate a premier adoption center, giving our animals, volunteers and adopters the best experience we can. While we operate on a very tight budget, several generous gifts have provided seed money to begin construction.

Before we could commit to such a large project, however, we needed to ensure all our current needs could be met. Our first responsibility is to our animals, and as we look to the future, we must maintain the present. Your gift to the WSHS – whether an annual gift, a monthly donation, a corporate sponsorship or a legacy gift – will save lives right now and will ensure that our mission of caring for homeless dogs and cats continues.

Because of you, we've been able to provide quality animal care for more than 46 years. With your help, we will continue to provide it for at least 40 more.
