The Board of Directors, volunteers staff members and I thank you for your extraordinary support. You have provided us with an unprecedented opportunity to secure our future and to advance our mission in 2013.

This year we were fortunate to receive several significant bequests. This money will be used to ensure that the homeless animals in our care receive quality care and to help us move toward our goal of building a new facility.

Our success has been built on the strong relationships we have with you – our supporters. Your generosity has enabled us to further our mission of helping the sick, injured, abused and homeless animals that make their way to the shelter each year. We could not do it without your help and generosity.

Last year we cared for and adopted out more than 650 dogs and cats. More than 550 dedicated volunteers contributed 35,000 hours of service to help rescued animals. One of the hallmarks of the WSHS brand has always been the dedication and commitment of the entire family of WSHS supporters. With a volunteer community of more than 550, WSHS thrives because of the devotion of its staff and volunteers to our mission of providing the best care possible as we find safe, permanent and compatible homes for dogs and cats. Just as important to our success are our adopters, many of whom have brought generations of WSHS pets into their homes and hearts, as well as generous donors whose faithful financial support allows us to be who we are. We were especially fortunate this past year to be remembered by several benevolent supporters in their final gift planning. Bequests to the shelter in 2013 exceeded \$464,000. Through March of this year, bequests already exceed \$350,000. As many of you know, we have long dreamed of building a new facility that will enable us to both improve the quality of care we are able to provide, as well as enhance the visitation and adoption experience. It is difficult to express how much this generosity means to us, both in fulfilling our ongoing mission as well as allowing us to plan for the future. Gifts such as these bring our plan for a new shelter closer to reality and the WSHS Board is moving forward in its strategic planning to raise the required funding for the new facility and develop preliminary facility plans. About WSHS

West Suburban Humane Society (WSHS) is a volunteer-based, animal welfare organization that was founded in 1972 as a lost and found referral service. We provide housing for up to 25 dogs and 60 cats at a time. We operate at full capacity at all times with animal care and adoptions being provided by three full-time and six part-time employees and more than 550 volunteers. Our facility is open to the public six days a week. We continue to reunite lost animals and their owners by maintaining a database with information on more than 33,000 pets and their owners, and by providing free pet identification tags to all pet owners.

Mission

WSHS is dedicated to operating a premier animal shelter for the purpose of finding safe, permanent and compatible homes to adopt domestic dogs and cats. We are committed to educating and encouraging the public to humanely care for dogs and cats.

Vision

WSHS will achieve and sustain its reputation for being the premier humane organization in Illinois. To achieve such recognition, WSHS will focus on the following critical components:

Advocacy: WSHS will promote the humane care of dogs and cats by working with government agencies and other agencies to promote the humane care of animals.

Care: WSHS will be the preeminent provider of animal care, working with high quality veterinarians to provide the most appropriate medical treatment for non-terminal conditions of cats and dogs in our care. Further, WSHS will develop innovative practices, such as working with reputable trainers in the area to ensure that every animal in our care receives the best total care before being adopted by the most compatible owner.

Education: WSHS will educate our staff, volunteers and members of the community on proper pet health care and safety. We will provide ample information and constant support to our adoptive families and act as an invaluable resource for educating the public at large.

Fundraising: WSHS will remain financially solvent and transparent so that we can continue to focus on finding new sources of revenue and maintaining our relationship with those who have provided financial contributions.

Values: We believe in the following core values:

- Serving as a resource to educate the community and animal owners about responsible dog and cat care.
- Providing high quality medical treatment for animals in our care.
- Controlling the pet population through spay and neuter
- To always act ethically and in the best interests of both animals and potential adopters.

- Working as a team to develop creative solutions for potential adopters and achieve the best results

Maddy- The Will to Survive

Lots of neighborhoods have that one cat who is always out and about. No one really knows where the cat belongs but everyone keeps an eye out for it. This was Maddy for almost two years. When her owner moved away, the other residents found out where she had lived because they could see her continuously sitting on the stoop, waiting for someone to come home and let her in. When it was apparent her family wasn't coming, neighbors started feeding Maddy and eventually she wound up pregnant; not an ideal situation, but it contained a silver lining for this girl. She was taken in and fostered by a local family with ties to WSHS. After she recovered from motherhood, Maddy went up for adoption.

Maddy seemed content to live in the cattery while waiting for her forever family to come. She was friendly with volunteers and visitors, and tolerant of the other cats. Her one issue was that she had never been a terrific eater at the shelter. One day she stopped eating altogether and took on the yellow tint of a cat with liver problems. Maddy was taken to the vet where she was diagnosed with fatty liver disease. This is a life-threatening condition that takes weeks, sometimes months, to overcome. It requires aggressive treatment and force-feeding. More than once, we thought we were losing Maddy, but her will to survive was strong and she bounced back over and over. She spent three weeks in the vet clinic, constantly being attended to by the staff before being released to her foster mom, who would continue tube feeding until Maddy was strong enough to eat on her own. Once at home, Maddy made faster progress and has now is fully recovered. After so much time and care, Maddy's foster mom could not imagine her life without Maddy in it. She adopted Maddy soon after.

West Suburban Humane Society is thankful for everyone who supports our mission. If it weren't for that support, Maddy would not be with us today, and with her unstoppable will, that would have been such a tragedy. Thank you!

Chance- Against All Odds

Chance has had a long road, literally and figuratively. His journey began in Texas where he was a stray puppy at animal control. A Texas rescue group took him in and he stayed there until he was almost a year old. In fact, he came within days of getting put down because no one wanted a deaf dog with a wobbly stature. Chance was saved at the last minute by A Place To Bark, near Nashville, TN, and WSHS then agreed to help him find a home.

Work-ups began immediately on Chance to find out why he was deaf and if it could be reversed. The wobbly legs and poor night vision needed to be diagnosed as well, so he saw the neurologist at VCA Aurora. After a spinal tap, MRI, x-rays and blood work, some things became clear.

Chance is deaf because of a congenital defect of the ears. In other words, he was born that way and there is no fix. It was also determined that Chance had distemper as a puppy and, unlike so many other dogs, he lived. The vision issues and his awkward gait were all caused by the distemper. The good news is that it won't get any worse. It won't get any better, but now Chance has a chance at a family of his own.

We want to give our animals every available opportunity, so Chance has been allowed to go to special training to learn hand signals. For a deaf dog to be able to communicate for the first time is a wondrous sight and Chance would never have had this opportunity without the backing of the WSHS supporters. We are proud to be able to give all the homeless animals at WSHS the same medical and behavioral care to which your own dogs and cats have access.

Why Give to WSHS?

The West Suburban Humane Society (WSHS) has been successful in achieving our mission of operating a premier animal shelter that has placed thousands of pets into their forever homes thanks to the support of our volunteers, adopters and community members. Since its founding in 1972, the shelter has operated on a very tight budget, and has relied completely on the generosity of its donors. Although there has never been an 'official' fundraising plan in place, WSHS has been very fortunate to consistently gain funding from its constituency in order to stay in operation. As we celebrate our 40th anniversary, we would like to thank those who have contributed to our success, and begin to look towards the next 40 years for the organization.

As anyone who has entered the shelter knows, WSHS is in great need of a new building. The current buildings in use have had major issues over the past few years including plumbing, electrical, and structural damage. Because most of our operating income from donations goes toward animal care and programs, WSHS has been forced to take a "band-aid" approach to these infrastructure issues. Furthermore, the building poses a limitation on the number of animals it can house. WSHS displays its commitment to dogs and cats by ensuring that all animals have safe housing, even if that means having 2-3 animals in every office within the building. A new building would allow WSHS to place more animals into their forever homes, while also providing a safe living and working environment for the entire WSHS family.

Even as WSHS begins to explore plans for a new building, we are mindful of the need to ensure that sufficient reserve funds are in place to successfully achieve our mission of placing pets into their forever homes. The rising costs of animal care (47% increase from 2007-2011), building maintenance and increased technology needs have caused us to take a conservative approach to managing the funds we have available. Until we gain a suitable level of sustainable annual donations to ensure that ongoing operating costs are well-covered, WSHS will remain cautious about committing to a new facility.

What can you do to help the shelter stay in operation another 40 years? WSHS is placing a "Call to Action" to its entire community. We have crafted a variety of ways people, foundations and corporations can give to the organization to assist in our mission of operating a premier animal shelter for the purpose of finding safe, permanent and compatible homes to adopt domestic dogs and cats. WSHS's hope is that everyone in our community can find a method of giving that is personally meaningful and financially manageable.

Ways to Give to WSHS

Annual Fund

All Annual Fund gifts are automatically reoccurring unrestricted donations which can be directly applied to the pressing needs of the shelter (medical care, building maintenance, etc.). The Annual Fund creates a recognized group of committed WSHS supporters. The monthly giving option allows donors to give a larger cumulative amount annually through smaller monthly installments withdrawn directly from the his/her bank or credit card account. WSHS recognizes a variety of giving levels:

- Animal Affiliate: \$250 (\$20.83/mo.)
- Senior Animal Affiliate: \$500 (\$41.67/mo.)
- Constant Companion Contributor: \$1,000 (\$83.33/mo.)
- Best Friend Benefactor: \$2,500 (\$208.33/mo.)
- Senior Best Friend Benefactor: \$5,000 (\$416.67/mo.)

Legacy Society (i.e. Planned Giving)

A gift from an estate plan leaves a lasting impression on the shelter and positively affects the future of WSHS. A planned gift signifies the donor's lifetime commitment to WSHS. A gift from a donor's estate allows he/she to contribute to WSHS without requiring any "out-of-pocket" giving. The Legacy Society creates a recognized group of committed WSHS supporters. Planned giving can help with effective estate tax planning.

Corporate Giving

Corporate gifts are unrestricted and can be directly applied to the pressing needs of the shelter (medical care, building maintenance, etc.). WSHS's mission is not controversial, and therefore, the majority of people and corporations can agree that it's a worthy cause for their community. By giving to WSHS, a corporation establishes itself as an asset to the community.

Corporate donors are acknowledged through multiple avenues (i.e. WSHS website, Annual Report, newsletters, etc.) which target thousands of residents in the western suburbs annually.

Special Event Corporate Sponsorship

A gift toward a WSHS special event allows businesses to contribute to an event in which it will receive direct and immediate recognition. By giving to a large scale event such as the 40th Anniversary Fundraiser and/or BarkaPALooza, companies can gain recognition as an asset to the community. Special Event Sponsorship is also a great avenue for a combination of cash and in-kind giving.

Today, it is more common than ever for people to create an estate plan. WSHS will miss Irene Halicka and has been fortunate to have received a gift from her estate in 2013.

Irene Halicka, a generous and dedicated volunteer of 15 years at WSHS, continued her philanthropic interests toward the cats, dogs and families we serve by including WSHS in her estate. Irene volunteered in the cattery and isolation area and helped out at various fundraising events. When she passed away, she was fostering Griffin, a 14 year old cat with hyperthyroidism, renal disease and a heart condition. Irene knew he wasn't adoptable, but took him home to make sure he spent the last years of his life in a loving home. Griffin is still with us and is now living with Irene's nephew.

Prior to Griffin, Irene fostered Bon Jour until he was healthy enough to be adopted. In addition to her willingness to foster animals, Irene adopted three cats (Tiger, Snickers and Shadow) who she met while volunteering at WSHS.

Irene's family said she had a great love of animals and truly enjoyed her volunteer work at WSHS. She was especially pleased with the renovation of the cattery and wanted to help WSHS expand its capacity to serve.

After Irene passed away in 2013, we learned about the generous bequest she had made to WSHS. She was a huge supporter of "no-kill" shelters and hoped her bequest would encourage others to include WSHS in their estate planning. She believed this would ensure the continuation and expansion of the great service and care WSHS provides for animals and families.
