Volunteer Spotlight

ndi Wiklund, who just joined the Tuesday Aafternoon kennel shift last month, considers herself lucky to join a crew of volunteers who all have a deep love for our WSHS dogs. Michele Sevcik agrees wholeheartedly; she can leave her worries at home while spending the afternoon each week surrounded by dedicated volunteers with the same goal of care and compassion.

With more than 65 combined years of service, these volunteers have found many ways to enrich the lives of dogs waiting for their adoptive homes as well as our local community. Jan Montalbano leads the shift and delivers excess pet food donations from WSHS to the Lisle Township food pantry. Holly Sansone and Michele volunteer together with WSHS cats on Monday afternoons as well, spreading their love beyond the kennel, and have been dog handlers at local events.

Kathy Jones also volunteers on Saturday evenings in the kennel, doubling her impact on our dogs, and Lynn Zalon has been pulled to help the animal care team with intake of new animals. They never know the effect they will have. Michele fondly remembers bringing WSHS puppies to a Pilates Studio for class. The interaction between the clients and the puppies was priceless. Fran Stenberg and Jan had a surprising end to their shift years ago when a potential adopter arrived at the kennel two minutes before shift's end. Everyone was shocked when the woman announced that she was a mystery shopper for Petco and gave WSHS a \$250 donation for the excellent service she received.

All of these volunteers have dogs of their own at home, but they know that dogs in a shelter environment do not have the same sense of security. Lynn says, "Each dog has their own story, and you must work to gain their trust. Trust, calm and consistency increase a dog's chance of adoption." Kathy adds that it's rewarding to see the dogs blossom under the collective attention of the WSHS volunteer community and that adoption day is such a happy time.

Fran takes pride as a handler, knowing that she can bring out the best in each dog by observing their body language to know what they need. It's not surprising that all of these volunteers have earned the status of advanced handlers and newcomer Andi isn't far behind. Her hope is "to give back and help the animals that can't help themselves and that deserve love."

The Tuesday afternoon volunteers not only love the dogs they serve; they also have formed deep friendships with one another. Lynn didn't realize the strength of their connection until she had a family emergency that prevented her from volunteering for a couple of months. Lynn felt lost without coming each week, but her team stayed in touch, supporting Lynn regularly from out-of-state, and letting her know they would be here when she returned.

These ladies are a perfect example of how WSHS helps more than just the homeless dogs and cats that come our way!





Hearty Thanks
